## "The soffioni" of Larderello (Volterra)



Who has not become curious when seeing the earth s steam near Volterra?

These natural events in the Larderello area (lakes, soft (hot steam coming naturally from the underground) a water springs) were already known to the Etruscans a Romans who used the boron salts for pharmaceutical for preparing glazes.

During the Middle Ages and the Renaissance, the wa

used for spa and pharmaceutical purposes.

In the second half of the eighteenth century, following the discovery of boric acid in the Volterra, the first attempts at commercial exploitation were made.

In 1818, Francesco Giacomo Larderel, a salesman of French origins, founded the first in centre for the production of borax near Montecerboli.

In a few decades, thanks to continuous technical innovations, the borax industry became leading-edge model in the industrial and technological panorama of Tuscany. In 1846, O Duke Leopold II, gave a local village the name Larderello in order to pay homage to the of the borax industry.

Some factories were built at Lustignano, Serrazzano, Monterotondo, Castel Nuovo, Sass Lago. The soffioni are currently used for the production of geothermal energy.
